Get Set is available to schools, colleges and local authority education providers in the UK. It is not available for the Higher Education sector.

What is the Get Set Network?

The Get Set network is will be made up of learning providers who are demonstrably living one or more of the Olympic and Paralympic values and are committed to integrating these values into their whole school development planning and ethos.
